Tree Removal

Spartanburg Water will be removing trees from the neighborhood in the coming months in order to protect the sewer line rights-of-way. Impacted neighbors have been notified.

HARB: Did You Know?!

In order to better protect the historic integrity of certain neighborhoods in the city, the City of Spartanburg established the Architectural Design and Historic Review Board (most often known as HARB). Administered by the Planning Department, this Board meets monthly to review major works undertaken within the Hampton Heights Historic District. Minor works are reviewed by city staff.

Normal maintenance and repair does not require approval by Planning Department staff or the review board, including the following changes:

1. Interior modifications
2. Painting (except unpainted masonry or concrete)
3. Replacement of window glass (but not entire windows)
4. Caulking and weather-stripping
5. Minor landscaping
6. Pruning trees and shrubbery and removal of trees less than six inches in diameter
7. Repairs using matching or original materials to walks, patios, fences and driveways
8. Replacements of small amounts of missing or deteriorated siding, trim, roof coverings, porch flooring, steps, etc using matching or original materials
9. Replacement of gutters similar to existing gutters
10. Temporary signs
11. Installation of house numbers and mailboxes that are compatible with the original in style, size and material.

Protect your property and safeguard it for future generations. If you have questions about the compatibility of your property modifications, contact the Planning Department at 596-2068.
